DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"The Demons deals with a subject seldom explored in cinema: children's fears. It is a story inspired by a blend of real-life events and perceptions that are not always anchored in reality, which have made a mark on my childhood in the late 1980s. Children in general are afraid of everything; in this twisted and imaginary realm, there is a very real and imperfect world, often dark and terrifying, in which adults totally driven by their inner demons move about." "In The Demons, my intention was not to follow a classic approach but to submit myself to the logic of life. Yes, there is tension. Yes, the characters have objectives. Yes, they struggle with their demons. And yes, the story has a structure of its own that builds to a kind of crescendo. Yet it is also a series of fragments – impressionistic tableaus drawn from life and memories. In the real world as in the realm of memories, some things remain unfinished, unresolved and mysterious. It is the exact opposite of stringing together a sequence of scenes within a carefully crafted narrative."

"My experience as a documentary filmmaker has deeply influenced the way I look at films. I realize that behind the apparent banality of everyday life, there are countless fascinating stories that are amazingly true to life and full of meaning. I believe I have become a better observer, always on the look-out, keen on weaving into the feature filmmaking process realistic elements acquired by filming real life." Genre DRAMA

DIRECTOR'S BIO

Philippe Lesage has directed four feature documentaries including "Can We Live Together?" (2006), "How You Can Tell If Little Fish Are Happy" (2009), and "Laylou" (2012). "The Heart That Beats" (2010) received many awards, including the Best Canadian Film Award, the Best Up and Coming Director Award at RIDM 2010, as well as the Jutra for Best Documentary in 2012. His first films were part of a retrospective at the Cinémathèque Québécoise in 2011. In between his various projects, Philippe Lesage had taught film studies at the European Film College in Denmark. His two drama feature films, "Copenhague A Love Story" and "The Demons" – already selected in numerous festivals – will open in theatres in 2015-2016. His next feature film, "Genesis", is in the works and is scheduled to be shot in the summer of 2016.

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
